This permit is issued pursuant to the provisions of C.R.S. Sec. 44-3-303(2) and is subject to the laws of the State of Colorado, including the provisions of Articles 3 and 4 of Title 44, Colorado Revised Statutes.

CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES MEDICAL DIRECTOR – LOGAN COUNTY AMBULANCE SERVICE

THIS CONTRACT made and effective as of the 1st day of January, 2021, by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN COUNTY, COLORADO, located at 315 Main Street, Sterling, Colorado 80751, hereinafter referred to as the "County," and QUANTUM PLUS, INC., a California corporation, whose address is 5000 Hopyard Road, Suite 100, Pleasanton, California 94588, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor."

WHEREAS, C.R.S. §§ 25-3.5-101 <u>et seq</u>. and 6 CCR 1015-3 – Chapter 2 require licensed ambulance services to have a physician medical director to provide medical direction to the ambulance service; and

WHEREAS, the County proposes to engage the Contractor to provide oversight and medical direction in the delivery of basic and advanced emergency medical and trauma services provided by Logan County Ambulance through personnel contracted by the County to perform such services, and this Contract sets forth the responsibilities of the County and Contractor for the provision of the services and the position of Medical Director.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and obligations set forth below, the parties agree as follows:

Section 1. The County agrees to and hereby appoints the Contractor to provide the services of a Medical Director for Logan County Ambulance, subject to the terms of this Agreement.

Section 2. <u>Term.</u> The appointment of the Contractor shall be effective from January 1, 2021 until December 31, 2023, and may be extended for an additional term of three years ending December 31, 2026, upon the review and mutual consent of the County and Contractor.

Section 3. <u>Compensation</u>. The County agrees to pay Contractor for the services provided as Medical Director the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per year, payable in four equal quarterly installments of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) each, due and payable on April 1, July 1, October 1 and January 1 for services provided in the previous quarter. If this Contract is terminated by either party prior to December 31 in any calendar year, the County shall pay the Contractor a prorated amount for the services actually provided up to the date of termination.

Section 4. <u>Scope of Services.</u> The parties mutually agree that the scope of services to be rendered by Contractor consist of "on-line" medical control and advice, as well as a specific physician to be jointly approved by the parties to perform quality assurance and monitor the performance of the Emergency Medical Service ("EMS") personnel separately contracted by the County and employed by Sterling Fire Department, Sterling, Colorado, all in accordance with the requirements of Colorado law and regulations more specifically described herein. The scope of services includes but is not limited to the following:

A. On-Line Service.

- 1. Twenty-four (24) hours per day, every day of the year, supervision of EMS personnel on duty with Sterling Fire Department and performing tasks within the specified medical responsibility of the Medical Director and/or medical protocols of Sterling Fire Department which have been previously specified or approved by the Medical Director.
- 2. Critique of field cases on presentation in the emergency department of Sterling Regional MedCenter.
- B. <u>Medical Director</u>. The specific physician Medical Director, who shall be jointly agreed upon by the parties and under whose medical license the County's EMS personnel are able to perform emergency medical services for the County, working through the Sterling Fire Department, shall be personally responsible for providing the following services:
 - Ongoing review and modification, if necessary, of any and all medical protocols which have been previously specified or approved. Any changes of such protocols shall be communicated to the Fire Chief, Sterling Fire Department, in written form consistent with the existing draft of said protocols and such protocols shall be the exclusive protocols for all EMS personnel working in the Sterling Fire Department. Any waivers, exceptions or modifications of such protocols shall be uniform within the Sterling Fire Department EMS service model.
 - 2. At the request of the Sterling Fire Chief, the Medical Director shall assist the Fire Chief in a) reviewing and recommending the use and purchase of equipment and supplies for Logan County Ambulance; b) developing a system for problem identifications, resolution and incident record keeping; c) developing a system of review and verification of skills and performance of EMS personnel employed by Sterling Fire Department; and d) developing a system for auditing or reviewing adherence to specified medical responsibility and medical protocols.
 - 3. Periodic critique of the response of EMS personnel to emergency calls.
 - 4. Direct observation of medical skills of EMS personnel, in the field, in training, and/or in the emergency department of Sterling Regional MedCenter. Field observations are to be conducted on a random basis at least quarterly.
 - 5. Quarterly participation in on-site training, and/or continuing education of EMS personnel on each unit shift.
 - 6. Audit of field responses through the use of trip report forms, radio communications and incident reports.

- 7. Monitor and maintain a system for the institution, evaluation and remediation for quality controls of EMS personnel operating under the medical oversight of the Medical Director, which includes submitting to the Fire Chief a written report of the performance of each new EMS employee or existing employees who desire to be approved for performance at a different EMS provider level.
- 8. Trip report reviews on problem cases will be scheduled by the Medical Director on a monthly basis with the Fire Chief. Deviations from established standards of care and/or protocols shall be communicated in writing to the Fire Chief and copied to the Medical Director.
- 9. The Medical Director shall work with the Fire Chief in evaluating the performance of EMS personnel and shall make recommendations to the Fire Chief regarding medical competency, training, and/or remediation of EMS personnel employed by Sterling Fire Department. Nothing contained herein shall require the designated Medical Director to supervise EMS personnel who are determined to be medically incompetent as documented to Sterling Fire Department by the designated Medical Director or the Contractor.
- 10. The Contractor, through the designated Medical Director, agrees to provide any other related administrative services that are set forth herein or that are otherwise required by Colorado statute or regulations, or are separately agreed upon.

Section 5. <u>Applicable Regulations.</u> The Contractor, acting through the designated Medical Director for Logan County Ambulance Service, agrees to possess the requisite qualifications, meet the requirements and otherwise provide the services in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Health Facilities and Emergency Medical Services Division, more specifically cited as 6 CCR 1015-3 – Chapter 2 – Practice and Medical Director Oversight Rules Pertaining to the State Emergency Medical and Trauma Care System, effective June 30, 2011 and as subsequently amended.

Section 6. **Designation of Medical Director.** The parties agree that, initially, the individual physician designated to perform the above-described services as Medical Director shall be Dr. Hillis. All individual physicians providing services under this Agreement shall meet or exceed all of the qualifications and requirements of Colorado law and the Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. If at any time the designated Medical Director is unable, or no longer agrees, to perform the services required by this Agreement, the parties shall mutually agree in writing upon another individual physician from Contractor's network to be designated to perform the services of Medical Director. If no individual physician suitable to County, in its sole discretion, is associated with the Contractor, the County may immediately terminate this Agreement.

Section 7. <u>Duties of County.</u> The County, acting though its contracted EMS provider, City of Sterling Fire Department, shall be responsible for the following:

- i. Assuring that the operating policies, regulations and/or bylaws of Logan County Ambulance Service will enable the Medical Director to perform the Scope of Services described in section 4, above.
- ii. Assuring that the Medical Director is made aware of any disputes, complaints, or disagreement involving EMS operational procedures.
- iii. Assuring that EMS personnel possess the training and skills required to meet the standards required by the Medical Director.
- iv. Providing the Medical Director with such resources, including specialized equipment, access to trip reports, medication logs, roster list, training records, etc., as may be necessary for the Medical Director to perform the services specified in Section 4, above.

Section 8. Insurance. The County shall provide, through its general liability insurance carrier, healthcare professional liability coverage for the administrative functions of the Medical Director performed within the authorized scope of the services contemplated by this Agreement. The parties acknowledge and mutually agree that the authorized scope of Contractor's services consists of performing the duties of Medical Director described in Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment regulations, 6 CCR 1015-3 – Chapter 2 – Practice and Medical Director Oversight Rules Pertaining To The State Emergency And Trauma Care System, and include the Contractor's review and approval of medical protocols and medical directives and the provision of oversight and quality improvement for Logan County Ambulance. In other respects, each party shall maintain Worker's Compensation insurance for its own employees, in amounts required by applicable state statutes, and separate liability insurance coverage sufficient to meet its anticipated liabilities for any losses, claims, injury or expenses that may be caused as a result of its performance of this Agreement, and each party shall hold the other party harmless from any liability whatsoever for losses, claims, injuries or expenses caused, or alleged to be caused, by the actions or negligence of the other party. Each party shall, upon request, provide to the other party information regarding relevant insurance and/or financial responsibility that is maintained pursuant to this Agreement. In the event that the insurance coverage for either party is cancelled, in whole or in part, or is no longer available, either party may elect to immediately terminate this Agreement. Before this agreement is so terminated, the terminating party must provide the other party three (3) days' advance notice of intent to terminate and an opportunity to cure the default within the ensuing three (3) days.

Section 9. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. In performing the services required by this contract, the Contractor and the designated Medical Director will remain an independent contractor and will not become an employee of the County. The Contractor, as an independent contractor, is obligated to pay state and federal income tax on money paid by the County and, except as provided in section 5, above, is solely responsible for obtaining any worker's compensation, property and liability insurance deemed necessary by the Contractor for performance of the services required by this contract.

Section 10. Default and Termination.

- A. Without Cause. Either the County or the Contractor may terminate this Agreement, without cause, upon providing the other party sixty (60) days advance written notice of the intended termination date.
- B. For Cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time in the event that the other party engages in an act or makes an omission constituting a material breach of any term or condition of this Agreement. The party electing to terminate this Agreement shall provide the other party with not less than thirty (30) days written notice specifying the nature of the breach. The party receiving notice shall then have thirty (30) days from the date of the notice in which to remedy the breach. If such corrective action is not taken within the time specified, this Agreement shall terminate at the end of the thirty (30) day period without further notice or demand. Additionally, this Agreement shall automatically terminate simultaneously with any termination of Contractor's agreement to provide services at Sterling Regional MedCenter.

Section 11. <u>Notices.</u> Notices and requests required by and given in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and deemed given as of the day they are received by a) hand delivery, b) overnight mail or express courier, or c) United States Mail, postage prepaid, certified with return receipt requested, and addressed to the parties at the addresses set forth below (or at the addresses otherwise provided by written notice and served in the same manner).

Section 16. <u>No Third Party Enforcement.</u> It is expressly understood and agreed that enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to the undersigned parties, and nothing contained in this Agreement shall give or allow any claim or right of claim whatsoever by any other person not included in this Agreement. It is the express intention of the undersigned parties that any entity, other than the undersigned parties, receiving services or benefits under this Agreement shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.
