LOGAN COUNTY, COLORADO REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS LAWN MOWING AND MAINTENANCE

Logan County, Colorado, is seeking proposals for lawn mowing and lawn maintenance at the following sites: Courthouse Square, 315 Main Street; Justice Center, 110 Riverview Road; and Logan County Heritage Center, 831 N. Division Avenue. A separate proposal may be submitted for mowing of the Sunset Memorial Gardens Cemetery. Interested firms or persons who have demonstrated an ability to provide similar services at comparable facilities are invited to submit proposals for any or all of the above facilities.

Scope of Services

Services for each of the above sites shall be in accordance with the following Scope of Services:

- 1. Mowing All lawn areas must be mowed every seven (7) days during the growing season (April October). Grass shall be cut to a length as recommended by Colorado State University Cooperative Extension Service, but no shorter than 1 1/2 inches nor longer than three (3) inches. Mower blades shall be kept sharp to prevent shredded grass tips that turn brown. There are to be no visible clippings after mowing and all grass must removed by the contractor. Sidewalks and hard surfaces shall be swept or blown clean after each mowing, and all mowing debris and dead growth shall be removed from the site.
- 2. Trimming/Edging Trimming shall be done along all walkways and hard surfaces, around trees, and any other areas every seven (7) days where necessary to maintain neat and trim appearance. Edging shall be performed 2 times during the growing season, as needed. Thatch over 1/2 inch in depth shall be removed from all turf areas once each fall.

The contractor shall provide at the contractor's sole cost all labor, equipment, and supplies required, including but not limited to mowers, trimmers, gasoline, waste disposal and transportation.

The contractor shall be flexible to work around community events that may be scheduled for the Courthouse lawn.

The contractor shall notify the County concerning problems with sprinklers or other issues with the grounds which need repair.

Sunset Memorial Gardens Cemetery

16339 County Road 41, Sterling, Colorado. Mowing of Sunset Memorial Gardens Cemetery, Entrance and Occupied (Buffalo Grass) areas of cemetery as needed due to moisture, April - September, estimated ten (10) times during the growing season, with special attention paid to timely mowing before Memorial Day weather permitting. Mowing unoccupied area (property perimeter) as needed due to moisture received, an estimated 7-10 times during the growing season.

County Option to Reject All Proposals

Logan County reserves the right to accept or reject any and all proposals and select the proposal which, in the judgment of the Board of County Commissioners, offers the best quality and best

satisfies the County's requirements. Logan County may elect where applicable, to award proposals on an individual site basis or on a combined site basis, whichever is most beneficial to Logan County.

Term of Contract

The term of the contract shall be for the duration of the annual growing season, which may consist of a period of approximately 7 months (commencing April 1, 2025, or as soon thereafter as lawn growth begins, through the end of the growing season, which in any case will occur no later than October 31, 2025) and shall contain a two-year renewal option for the 2026 and 2027 growing seasons which may be exercised by the parties upon mutual agreement prior to expiration of the initial contract term. Any contract may be canceled or terminated at any time by the County without cause, upon providing at least 30 days written notice to the contractor. The contract may otherwise be terminated for cause, including, without limitation, the failure of the Board of County Commissioners to appropriate funding for the contract for any subsequent fiscal year.

Payment Date and Right of Set-off

Payment for services performed shall be made in equal installments on or before the 10th day of the month for services performed in the prior month. Logan County reserves the right to set-off and deduct from the monthly payment otherwise due the following sums for any instances of the contractor's failure to timely perform the services described in the Scope of Services:

For any week where grass is not mowed or edges trimmed at any site, the sum of \$100 per site shall be deducted from the monthly payment otherwise due unless failure to perform was caused by inclement weather.

For any week where sidewalks, concrete or other hard surface areas are not swept and cleaned after mowing/trimming at any site, the sum of \$50 per site shall be deducted from the monthly payment otherwise due unless failure to perform was caused by inclement weather.

Insurance Requirements

Contractor shall procure and maintain during the duration of the contract, at contractor's sole cost, insurance policies with minimum limits not less than: (1) Comprehensive General Liability of \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage; (2) Automobile Liability of \$500,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage; and (3) Workers Compensation coverage as required by the laws of the State of Colorado. Lawn Mowing on a weekly or by-weekly basis spanning from April thru October. We have cleaned up leaves as late as Thanksgiving on a weekly or by-weekly schedule or as requested by the customer. The mowing height is as recommended by Colorado State University Cooperative Extension Dept. In the spring during cooler temperatures we mow at 2" to 2 ½" tall and during the heat of the summer we mow as high as 3". We train our lawns up in height at a slow rate so it doesn't lay down and it gains rigidity. Trimming as needed as to not stress the lawn. Trimming along the sidewalks is not recommended due to the stress it will cause to the lawn and it will promote weed growth. The height of the lawn along the edges is needed due to the heat off the sidewalks. Grass Clippings are picked up and removed. We may mulch clippings if the finish appearance is acceptable. All lawn debris are blown off sidewalks as needed.

In the event that the properties can't be done on the scheduled day due to inclement weather we move them to the following day.

We have been edging sidewalks in the spring. Edging can be done for special events such as the parade, sugar beet days and any events if requested. We edge in the fall during the last mowing for a better winter time appearance if requested.

AGREEMENT FOR LAWN MOWING AND LAWN MAINTENANCE

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 18th day of March, 2025, by and between the Logan County Board of County Commissioners, whose address is Logan County Courthouse, 315 Main, Sterling, Colorado 80751, hereinafter the "County," and Dave's Mowing and Maintenance, whose address is 13701 Sunny Knolls Lane, Sterling, Colorado 80751, hereinafter the "Contractor."

WHEREAS, the County has prepared a Request For Proposals for lawn mowing and lawn maintenance for the Courthouse Square, located at 315 Main St.; the Logan County Justice Center, located at 110 Riverview Road; the Logan County Heritage Center, located at 821 N. Division Avenue; and Sunset Memorial Gardens, located at 16399 County Road 41, all in Sterling, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has bid the sum of \$450.00 per week to perform the services described in the Request For Proposals, more particularly: Justice Center - \$75.00 per week; Courthouse Square - \$300.00 per week; and Logan County Heritage Center - \$75.00 per week; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has bid the sum of \$5,500.00 per season to perform services described in the Request For Proposals for Sunset Memorial Gardens, more particularly: (1) (entry area and occupied areas) - \$1000.00 per month for May, June, July, August, and September and \$500.00 for the month for October; including a minimum of at least ten (10) mows, as needed and depending on rainfall and (2) (unoccupied property perimeter) - \$1,000 per mowing season, estimated mowing to occur 7 to 10 times per season but will consist of additional mowing as needed, depending on rainfall; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has appropriate equipment, supplies and staff to perform the services described in the Request For Proposals; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to acquire the Contractor's services for the term of this Agreement, and the Contractor offers to provide such services upon the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants and obligations set forth herein, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

- 1. **Form of Agreement.** The agreement, terms and conditions constituting the contract between the parties consists of this Agreement for Lawn Mowing and Lawn Maintenance, which is intended to become the complete agreement between the parties. No prior or other agreements or understandings shall be valid or enforceable, nor shall the written agreements be modified or altered, unless in a writing signed by both parties.
- 2. **Engagement and Duties.** During the term of this Agreement the County engages the Contractor to perform the services and specifications described below and the Contractor hereby

agrees to serve the County in the performance of the services as an independent contractor. It is expressly understood that the Contractor and its officers, agents and employees are not employees of Logan County but are independent contractor(s) and shall act in an independent capacity and not as an officer, agent, servant, employee, joint venturer, partner or associate of the County. Because of its status as an independent contractor, Contractor shall have absolutely no right to employment rights and benefits available to County employees. Contractor shall be solely liable and responsible for providing to, or on behalf of, its employees all legally required benefits. Contractor shall be solely responsible and save the County harmless from all matters relating to the payment of Contractor's employees, including compliance with Social Security, withholding, and all other regulations governing such matters. The Contractor shall provide all personnel, supplies and equipment required to perform complete mowing and maintenance of lawns located at:

- I. The Courthouse Square, the Logan County Justice Center, and the Logan County Heritage Center, described as follows:
- a. **Mowing** All lawn areas must be mowed every seven (7) days during the growing season (April-October). In the event that the mowing cannot be done on the scheduled day due to inclement weather, mowing will move to the following day. If mowing to coincide with special events is desired, the County shall provide the Contractor at least ten (10) days advance notice of the date of the special event and the Contractor shall be flexible to work around community events that may be scheduled for the Courthouse lawn. - b. **Trimming** Trimming will occur as needed to preserve the health of the lawn areas.
- c. Edging Edging is not included in the monthly services. At its option, the County may separately purchase edging. If requested, the Courthouse sidewalks will be edged three (3) times each season at a price of \$200.00 per edging. - 3. **Inspection.** All services must be performed to the personal satisfaction of the Logan County Board of County Commissioners, or its designee. Periodic inspections by the county commissioners or designee will occur to identify problem areas, if any, and determine remedial actions. The Contractor shall notify the County if problems with sprinklers or repair issues with the grounds are observed.
- 4. **Equipment and Supplies.** The Contractor shall provide all labor, equipment, and supplies required, including but not limited to mowers, trimmers, gasoline, waste disposal and transportation, at no cost to the County.
- 5. **Term.** The term of this Agreement shall be for the duration of the annual growing season, which may consist of a period of approximately seven (7) months (commencing April 1, 2025, or as soon thereafter as lawn growth begins, through the end of the growing season, which in any case will occur no later than October 31, 2025) and shall contain a two-year renewal option for the 2026 and 2027 growing seasons, which may be exercised by the parties upon mutual agreement prior to March 1, annually. This Agreement may be canceled or terminated at any time by the County without cause, upon providing at least 30 days written notice to the Contractor. This Agreement may otherwise be terminated by the County for cause and without advance notice, including, without limitation, the failure of the Board of County Commissioners to appropriate funding for the contract for any subsequent fiscal year.

6. Consideration.

For the Courthouse Square, the Logan County Justice Center, and the Logan County Heritage Center, the County shall pay the Contractor the sum of \$450.00 per week for performance of all services required hereunder, allocated as follows:



PUBLIC CONTRACT FOR SERVICES KP, LLC. dba KP Elections Services

BALLOT PRINTING & MAILING 2025

THIS PUBLIC CONTRACT FOR SERVICE (the "Contract") is made and entered into effective this ___day of _____, 2025 by and between the CLERK & RECORDER OF THE COUNTY OF LOGAN, STATE OF COLORADO, an elected official and the Designated Election Official for Logan County, with a principal address of 315 Main Street, Suite 3, Sterling, CO 80751 (the "County") and KP, LLC dba KP Elections Services, a corporation authorized to do business in the State of Colorado with a principal address of 3700 Seaport Blvd., Suite 10, West Sacramento, CA 95691 (the "Consultant").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the County is undertaking certain activities for preparation and printing of election materials including ballots, envelopes, insertion and mailing for the 2025 Elections to be held in Logan County; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to engage the Consultant to render certain professional services and assistance in connection with such election, with the potential for providing services for future elections as well; an

WHEREAS, the Consultant has the ability to assist the County through its professional expertise, knowledge, and experience, and is ready, willing, and able to provide such services, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and other goods and valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

1. LINE OF AUTHORITY: The County Elections Supervisor ("Authorized Representative"), is designated as Authorized Representative of the County for the purpose of administering, coordinating, and approving the work performed by the Consultant under this contract. The Authorized Representatives for the Consultant are Laura Zylak and Darren Loken.

2. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

- A. Parties agree that Consultant shall print election materials at the rate indicated in the attached Exhibit A. Consultant agrees to print ballots and other election materials for the 2025 Election to be held in Logan County, Colorado as follows:
 - Duplex Ballots, size to be determined
 - Outer/Carrier Ballot Envelopes (Domestic and UOCAVA), to include return address

- Return/Reply Envelopes with open signature
- Optional Ballot Voter Instructions
- Optional "I Voted" stickers as designated by the County

Parties understand and agree that the actual amount and size of ballots may change, and may not be finalized until closer to the Election.

- B. Consultant agrees to mail ballot packets to Logan voters as designated by the County.
- C. The Parties agree to work jointly in good faith to establish time frames for performance by each party, including but not limited to: a deadline for the County to provide ballot faces and a deadline for Consultant to mail the ballots to the County's registered voters. All deadlines shall adhere to statutory requirements.
- D. The County may, from time to time, request changes to the scope of services to be performed hereunder. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of the Consultant's compensation, which are mutually agreed upon between the County and Consultant, shall be in writing and shall become part of this Contract upon execution. No change in the scope of services that will result in an increase in the amount of compensation may be effective unless the County confirms in writing the availability of funds for such increase.
- E. The Consultant agrees to diligently and professionally perform all the services described herein in a manner satisfactory to the Authorized Representative. It is also understood and agreed that the Consultant shall not, in performing services hereunder, undertake any action or activity prohibited by the terms of any lease, permit, license, or other agreement in effect during the term hereof between the Consultant and the County for the use and occupancy by the Consultant of any County facilities or space.
- 3. COMPENSATION: Subject to the maximum contract liability and all other provisions of this Contract, the County agrees to pay the Consultant, and the Consultant agrees to accept payment as provided herein.
- 4. MAXIMUM CONTRACT EXPENDITURE: Any other provision of this Contract, notwithstanding and pursuant to Section §29-1-110, C.R.S., the amount of funds appropriated for this Contract is \$24,000 for printing Ballots, Outer and Return envelopes, Instruction Sheets, etc. (not including postage) for the 2025 Coordinated Election. In no event shall the County be liable for payment under this Contract for any amount in excess thereof without express and written approval confirming such and confirmation of the availability of funds in excess of this stated amount. The County is not under obligation to make any future apportionment or allocation to this Contract, nor is anything set forth herein a limitation of liability for Consultant. Any potential expenditure for this Contract outside the current fiscal year is subject to future annual appropriation of funds for any such proposed expenditure.
- 5. TERM: It is mutually agreed by the parties that the term of this Contract shall commence upon its effective date, specified above, and terminate at 11:59 PM on 12/31/2025. This Agreement, at the option of the County, may be renewed with appropriate adjustments to election material

numbers, if written notice is given to the Consultant by the County on or before the termination of the current and successive terms, confirmed by an Addendum to this Contract. This Contract and/or any extension of its original term shall be contingent upon annual funding being appropriated, budgeted and otherwise made available for such purposes and subject to the County's satisfaction with all products and services received during the preceding term.

- 6. INVOICING PROCEDURES: Payments shall be made to the Consultant based upon invoices submitted by the Consultant, provided such invoices have been approved by the Authorized Representative. Payments will be made to the Consultant within thirty (30) days, or within a mutually agreed upon period after the County has received complete invoices from the Consultant. The County reserves the right to require such additional documentation, including monthly activity reports detailing the Consultant's activities and services rendered, as the County deems appropriate to support the payments to the Consultant. The signature of an officer of the Consultant shall appear on all invoices certifying that the invoice has been examined and found to be correct.
- 7. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: The Consultant agrees that no official, or employee of the County shall have any personal or beneficial interest whatsoever in the services or property described herein, and the Consultant further agrees not to hire, pay, or contract for service any official, officer, or employee of the County. A conflict of interest shall include transactions, activities, or conduct that would affect the judgment, actions, or work of the Consultant by placing the Consultant's own interests, or the interest of any party with whom the Consultant has a contractual arrangement, in conflict with those of the County.
- 8. INDEMNIFICATION: The County cannot, and by this Contract does not, agree to indemnify, hold harmless, exonerate, or assume the defense of the Consultant or any other person or entity whatsoever for any purpose whatsoever. The Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County, its commissioner's, officials, director's, agents, and employees for any and all claims, demands, suits, actions, or proceedings of any kind or nature whatsoever, including workers' compensation claims, in any way resulting from or arising from this Contract; provided, however, that the Consultant need not indemnity or hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, and employees from damages resulting from the sole negligence of the County's commissioner's officials, officers, agents, or employees.
- 9. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: The Consultant is an independent contractor and is free to perform services for other clients. Notwithstanding any provision of this contract, all personnel assigned by the Consultant to perform work under this Contract shall be, and remain at all times, employees of Consultant for all purposes. The independent contractor is not entitled to workers' compensation or unemployment benefits through the County and is obligated to pay federal and state income tax on any monies earned pursuant to the contract relationship.
- 10. NO WAIVER OF GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY ACT: The Parties hereto understand and agree that the County, its commissioners, officials, officers, directors, agents, and employees are relying on, and do not waive or intend to waive by any provisions of this Contract, the monetary limitations or any other rights, immunities and protections provided by the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, § 24-10-101 to 120, C.R.S., or otherwise available to the County.

- 11. ASSIGNMENT: The Consultant agrees that it will not assign or transfer its rights hereunder, or subcontract any work hereunder, either in whole or in part, without the prior written approval of the Authorized Representative. Any attempt by the Consultant to assign or transfer its rights hereunder shall, at the option of the Authorized Representative, void the assignment or automatically terminate this Contract and all rights of the Consultant hereunder.
- 12. COUNTY REVIEW OF RECORDS: The Consultant agrees that, upon request of the Authorized Representative, at any time during the term of this Contract or for twenty five (25) months thereafter, it will make full disclosure to the County and make available for inspection and audit upon request by the Authorized Representative, the County Director of Finance, or any of their authorized representatives, all of its records associated with work performed under this Contract for the purpose of making an audit, examination or excerpts. The Consultant shall maintain such records until the expiration of three (3) years following the end of the term of this Contract.
- 13. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS: Drawings, specifications, guidelines, and any other documents prepared by the Consultant in connection with this Contract shall be the property of the County.
- 14. ASSIGNMENT OF COPYRIGHTS: The Consultant assigns to the County the copyrights to all works prepared, developed, or created pursuant to this Contract, including the right to: 1.) reproduce the work; 2.) prepare derivative works; 3.) perform the works publicly; and, 4.) to display the work publicly. The Consultant waives its right to claim authorship of the works, to prevent its name from being used wrongly in connection with the works, and to prevent distortion of the works.
- 15. TERMINATION: The County shall have the right to terminate this Contract, with or without cause, by giving written notice to the Consultant of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, which notice shall be given at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of such termination. In such event, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, and reports prepared by the Consultant pursuant to this Contract shall become the County's property. The Consultant shall be entitled to receive compensation in accordance with this Contract for any satisfactory work completed pursuant to the term of this Contract prior to the date of notice of termination. Notwithstanding the above, the Consultant shall not be relieved of liability to the County for damages sustained by the County by virtue of any breach of this Contract by the Consultant.
- 16. PERFORMANCE: Due to the sensitive nature of this scope of work, and the need for error-free performance, Consultant agrees to use best efforts to perform the Scope of Work with no errors, and to remedy any defect in performance, defect in printed election material, bar codes, or other required data. Consultant will indemnify the County against all costs and damages, including indirect costs of County to remedy defective election material or other errors or mistakes resulting from Consultant's performance of the scope of work.
- 17. NOTICES: Notices concerning termination of this Contract, notices of alleged or actual violations of the terms or provisions of this Contract, and all other notices shall be made as follows:

Said notices shall be delivered personally during normal business hours to the appropriate office above, or by prepaid first-class U.S. Mail, email, via facsimile, or any other method authorized in writing by the Authorized Representative. Mailed notices shall be deemed effective upon receipt or three (3) days after the date of mailing, whichever is earlier. The Parties may from time-to-time designate substitute addresses or persons where and to whom such notices are to be mailed or delivered, but such substitution shall not be effective until actual receipt of written notification.

- 18. NONDISCRIMINATION: In connection with the performance of work under this Contract, the Consultant agrees not to refuse to hire, discharge, promote or demote, or to discriminate in matters of compensation against any person otherwise qualified, solely because of race, color, religion, national origin, gender, age, military status, sexual orientation, marital status, or physical or mental disability.
- 19. GOVERNING LAW; VENUE: This Contract shall be deemed to have been made in, and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado. Venue for any action hereunder shall be in the District Court, County of Logan, State of Colorado. The Consultant expressly waives the right to bring any action in or to remove any action to any other jurisdiction, whether state or federal.
- 20. COMPLIANCE WITH ALL LAWS AND REGULATIONS: All of the work performed under this Contract by the Consultant shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, and codes of the United States and the State of Colorado. The Consultant shall also comply with all applicable ordinances, regulations, and resolutions of the County and shall commit no trespass on any public or private property in the performance of any of the work embraced by this Contract.
- 21. SEVERABILITY: In the event any of the provisions of this Contract are held to be unenforceable or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be affected. Should either party fail to enforce a specific term of this Contract it shall not be a waiver of subsequent right of enforcement, nor shall it be deemed a modification or alteration of the terms and conditions contained herein.

- 22. NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES: The enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Contract and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to the County and the Consultant, and nothing contained in this Contract shall give or allow any such claim or right of action by any other or third person under such Contract.
- 23. ADVERTISING AND PUBLIC DISCLOSURE: The Consultant shall not include any reference to this Contract or services performed pursuant to this Contract in any of Consultant's advertising or public relations materials without first obtaining the written approval of the Logan County Media Relations Officer. Nothing herein, however, shall preclude the transmittal of any information to officials of the County, including without limitation, the County Manager and the Board of County Commissioners.
- **24. PRIORITY OF PROVISIONS:** In the event that any terms of this Contract and any Exhibit, attachments, or other referenced document are inconsistent, the following order of priority shall control:
 - 1st This Contract
 - 2nd Pricing Summary attached hereto as Exhibit A
- 25. **HEADINGS**; **RECITALS**: The headings contained in this Contract are for reference purposes only and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation of this Contract. The Recitals to this Contract are incorporated herein.
- 26. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: The Parties acknowledge and agree that the provisions contained herein constitute the entire agreement and that all representations made by any commissioner, official, officer, director, agent, or employee of the respective parties, unless included herein, are null and void and of no effect. NO alterations, amendments, changes or modifications to this Contract, except those which are expressly reserved herein to the Authorized Representative, shall be valid unless they are contained in writing and executed by all the parties with the same formality as this Contract.
- 27. INSURANCE: The Consultant shall be required to maintain appropriate insurance as required by law. The Consultant shall provide evidence that such requirements have been met and shall provide updated information to the County in the event any changes are made to the Consultant's insurance coverage during the term of this Contract.
- 28. COUNTY EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT: This Contract is expressly subject to, and shall not be or become effective or binding on the County, until execution by all authorized signatories of the County.
- 29. FORCE MAJEURE: NO party shall be liable for failure to perform hereunder if such failure to perform is the result of *force majeure*. Any time limit shall be extended for the period of any delay resulting from any *force majeure*, or this Contract may be terminated if such delay makes performances of the Contract impossible or impracticable. *Force majeure* shall mean causes beyond the reasonable control of a party such as, but not limited to, weather conditions, acts of God, strikes, work stoppages, unavailability of or delay in receiving labor or materials, faults by contractors, subcontractors, utility companies or third parties, fire or other casualty or action of government authorities.

RESOLUTION

No. <u>2025-7</u>

A resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Logan County, Colorado, cancelling certain tax sale certificates issued in error as a result of erroneous severed mineral assessments.

WHEREAS, tax liens on certain severed mineral interests were sold for nonpayment of delinquent ad valorem property taxes, as identified in the attached Exhibit A, and subsequently accrued taxes have been paid by the tax lien certificate holders; and

WHEREAS, the tax liens identified in Exhibit A should not have been sold at the tax sale because they involved incorrectly identified and assessed severed mineral interests; and

WHEREAS, the tax lien certificate purchasers have been advised of the errors and may assign their certificates to Logan County in order to receive reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, C.R.S. §39-12-111, provides that when, by mistake or error of the treasurer, county clerk and recorder, or assessor or from double assessment, a tax lien has been sold on land upon which no tax was due at the time, the county shall reimburse the purchaser the amount paid in connection with the purchase of the tax lien, together with interest at a rate equal to the two percentage points above the discount rate or 8% per annum, whichever is greater.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Logan County, Colorado, as follows:

- 1. The tax lien certificate holders listed on Exhibit A may be reimbursed the purchase price and subsequent taxes from the various funds to which the tax payments were originally distributed, together with statutory interest pursuant to C.R.S. §39-12-111.
- 2. The tax sale certificates shown on Exhibit A are hereby cancelled.
- 3. The taxes assessed on the severed mineral interests for the tax years shown on Exhibit A are hereby cancelled and abated pursuant to C.R.S. §§39-11-107 and 39-10-114 because the mineral interests were incorrectly assessed.
