Shall there be a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes concerning a prohibition on the hunting of mountain lions, lynx, and bobcats, and in connection therewith, prohibiting the intentional killing, wounding, pursuing, entrapping, or discharging or releasing of a deadly weapon at a mountain lion, lynx, or bobcat; creating eight exceptions to this prohibition including for the protection of human life, property, and livestock; establishing a violation of this prohibition as a class 1 misdemeanor; and increasing fines and limiting wildlife license privileges for persons convicted of this crime?

Proposition 131 (STATUTORY)

Shall there be a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes creating new election processes for certain federal and state offices, and, in connection therewith, creating a new all-candidate primary election for U.S. Senate, U.S. House of Representatives, governor, attorney general secretary of state, treasurer, CU board of regents, state board of education, and the Colorado state legislature; allowing voters to vote for any one candidate per office, regardless of the voter's or candidate's political party affiliation; providing that the four candidates for each office who receive the most votes advance to the general election; and in the general election, allowing voters to rank candidates for each office on their ballot, adopting a process for how the ranked votes are tallied, and determining the winner to be the candidate with the highest number of votes in the final tally?

SHALL FRENCHMAN SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. CONSTRUCTING AND EQUIPPING A NEW SCHOOL BUILDING TO REPLACE THE EXISTING FACILITY THAT MEETS CURRENT HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT COMPLIANT, ENERGY EFFICIENT AND TECHNOLOGICALLY UP TO DATE TO MEET THE EDUCATIONAL NEEDS OF THE FLEMING SCHOOL DISTRICT;

PROVIDED THAT NO BONDS WILL BE ISSUED UNLESS THE BEST GRANT IS RECEIVED;

WITH SUCH GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO BEAR INTEREST, MATURE, BE SUBJECT TO REDEMPTION, WITH OR WITHOUT PREMIUM OF NOT MORE THAN THREE PERCENT, AND BE ISSUED AT SUCH TIME, AT SUCH PRICE (AT, ABOVE OR BELOW PAR) AND IN SUCH MANNER AND CONTAINING SUCH TERMS, NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THIS BALLOT ISSUE, AS THE BOARD OF EDUCATION MAY DETERMINE, AND SHALL AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES BE LEVIED WITHOUT LIMIT AS TO THE MILL RATE TO GENERATE AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT IN EACH YEAR TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON SUCH DEBT AND ANY DEBT ISSUED TO REFUND SUCH DEBT, OR TO CREATE A RESERVE FOR THE SAME, PROVIDED THAT ANY REVENUE PRODUCED BY SUCH MILL LEVY SHALL NOT EXCEED \$840,000 ANNUALLY; AND SHALL SUCH TAX REVENUES AND THE EARNINGS FROM THE INVESTMENT OF SUCH BOND PROCEEDS AND TAX REVENUES BE COLLECTED, RETAINED AND SPENT AS A VOTER APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE UNDER ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION OR ANY OTHER LAW; AND WITHOUT EXCEEDING THE ABOVE AMOUNTS. FOR TIMELY BOND REPAYMENT SHALL THE DISTRICT BE ALLOWED TO RETAIN AND SPEND PROPERTY TAX REVENUE ABOVE OTHER ANNUAL LIMITS WHICH MIGHT OTHERWISE APPLY OR BE PROPOSED, FROM THE DATE OF ISSUANCE OF ANY BONDS AUTHORIZED BY THIS BALLOT MEASURE UNTIL THE FINAL MATURITY OF SAME?
