<u>Election Information:</u> Know the Facts for Colorado!

Rules for determining residence for voting purposes:

C.R.S. 1-2-102 (1) (a) The residence of a person is the principal or primary home or place of abode of a person. A principal or primary home or place of abode is that hone or place in which a person's habitation if fixed and to which that person, whenever absent has the present intention of returning after a departure or absence, regardless of the duration of the absence. You must have a residential address to register to vote. Once you establish a residence, it exists until you establish a new residence elsewhere and notify the election division of that change.

A residence is a permanent building or part of a building and may include a house, condominium, apartment, room in a house, or mobile home.

No vacant lot or business address shall be considered a residence.

<u>A mail service business can not be used for a residence address</u>. A mail service business can ONLY be used for a mailing address.

(II) (c) The residence given for voting purposes shall be the same as the residence given for motor vehicle registration and for state income tax purposes.

Note: For voter registration, you may not have more than one residence.

Your residential address determines what you are eligible to vote on for elections.

- If your residential address is the City limits of Sterling you **would be** eligible to vote on City of Sterling candidates and questions.
- If your residential address is outside of the City of Sterling you <u>would not</u> be eligible to vote on city of Sterling candidates or questions.

Can a post office box be used or a mail service box be used as a <u>mailing address</u> for voter registration purposes?

- Yes. <u>Post office boxes and mail service boxes are ONLY acceptable as a mailing address</u>. Meaning, that if a homeless voter uses a physical location that does not have a mailing address (such as a park), he/she may provide a post office as a mailing address.
- <u>Post office boxes, are NEVER acceptable for residence purposes.</u>
- <u>Mail Service Boxes, are NEVER acceptable as a residence purpose.</u>
