Upon introduction it shall be read a first time and a day and hour set at which the council or a committee shall hold a public hearing thereon. Such hearing may be at a regular meeting of the council or at such time and place as the council may order and may be adjourned from time to time. An ordinance, before final passage, shall be read in at least two (2) regular meetings of the council, may be amended on its first reading, and shall be published once in a manner that provides reasonable notice to the public, which may include publication in the print or online edition of a newspaper of general circulation in the city, or other methods consistent with general law, at least ten (10) days before its final passage.
